This replies to yours of August 30, 1974.

The Federal Employees' Compensation Act and regulations require a that job commented injuries be properly reported to the Office of Morkers' Compensation Progrems. CA-1-2 should be sent here on any injury involving loss of time from work, or involving medical expense or where there may be some permanent disability.

Nog bite injuries wherein medical expense is involved should be reported here.

If you are of the opinion that there is intentional refusal or neglect by the Postmaster to send in reporting forms on work injuries, you have the privilege of filing a documented complaint with this office for consideration of action under the criminal statute found in 18 U.S.C. 1922.
